1.	Prof. Patrick Engeu Ogwang	Soroti	<p>Professor Patrick Engeu Ogwang possesses a PhD in Pharmacy and Pharmacology from Makerere University. He is a renowned researcher in herbal medicines, Head of Pharmacy and Senior Lecturer at Mbarara University of Science and Technology (MUST) and a former executive member of the Pharmaceutical Society of Uganda.</p> <p>He is the founder of the herbal remedy “Covidex”, a supportive COVID-19 treatment.</p> <p>The Pharmaceutical Society of Uganda (PSU) applauded Ogwang’s efforts to develop Covidex “considering that no proven cure for the pandemic has yet been established globally”.</p> <p>He is a leading researcher of Pharmbiotrac that produced a sanitizer (Pharmsan) in response to curbing down COVID-19.</p> <p>He served as a Research Officer at the Natural Chemotherapeutics Research Institute, Ministry of Health, Uganda</p> <p>Other research he has carried out; He led an evaluation mission to Kenya to examine the results of a school program implemented by Kenyatta University to protect school children and prisoners against malaria and other infectious diseases with natural extracts from <i>Artemisia annua</i> planted by the children and prisoners. The mission took place from January 13-25, 2014.</p> <p>He continues to meet with international researchers interested the usage of <i>Artemisia annua</i> tea to prevent malaria in communities and households.</p>

			<p>Special Accomplishments</p> <p>Dr. Ogwang is the Principal Investigator of the World Bank African Center of Excellence Project at Mbarara University of Science & Technology. He received an award from the Ministry of Health at its 20th Joint Review Mission on October 22, 2014 for outstanding achievement in research on the herbal prevention of malaria.</p>

			<p>Her current appointment is in the Department of Paediatrics and Child Health in the School of Medicine at the Makerere University College of Health Sciences. In addition, she is the site Principal Investigator for the Makerere University-Johns Hopkins University clinical research site in Kampala –Uganda, in the NIH supported IMPAACT Network.</p> <p>Prof. Musoke is board certified in Pediatric infectious diseases and has been conducting clinical trials in perinatal HIV prevention and childhood tuberculosis since 1995, and implementing studies/programs for paediatric antiretroviral therapy in resource limited settings.</p> <p>Prof. Musoke’s researched the remedy prevention of mother to child HIV transmission through breast feeding, simplification of anti-retroviral regimens for children from resource limited settings and epidemiology, diagnosis and immunology of childhood tuberculosis this has saved many from contracting HIV/AIDS from their mothers not only in Uganda but in Africa and the World over.</p>

Dr. Joseph Epodoi (Lead surgeon)	Soroti	<p>The medical team headed by Dr Joseph Epodoi working at Soroti Hospital were faced with a conjoined baby girl twins, one was dead and the second live one was attached to the decomposing sister, who was a still birth. They were referred to Soroti Regional Referral Hospital however on assessment they were further referred to Mulago National Referral Hospital for better management. Mulago apparently had no capacity to help the baby attached to a dead one sharing liver, chest wall etc and at risk of being poisoned.</p> <p>The family finally returned to Soroti. True to the Hippocratic Oath he took at Makerere University years ago, Dr Joseph Epodoi, assembled the team and went into theater to separate the twins. Five hours later, Epodoi emerged, having successfully separated the live baby from the one that had been dead for six days.</p>

A woman of Faith who is a leader and mentor in her profession.</p> <p>She is a senior lecturer at UCU who has encouraged and supported many women to achieve their goals and aspirations.</p> <p>She holds a Bachelor of Arts with Education Degree, awarded by Makerere University, and a Master of Arts in Journalism awarded by the University of Iowa. She also obtained a Doctorate of Literature and Philosophy in Communication from the University of South Africa, Pretoria.</p> <p>She was appointed Head of Department of Mass Communications at UCU. She nurtured the department into the Faculty of Journalism, Media and Communication (FJMC). In March 2019, the faculty offered (i) a Bachelor of Journalism and Communication degree (ii) a Master Arts in Journalism and Media Studies degree (iii) a Master of Arts in Strategic Communication.</p> <p>In May 2019, UCU promoted Dr. Monica Balya Chibita to the rank of full professor, in recognition</p>

			<p>of her body of work. As of May 2020, the UK top Journalism Board appointed Prof. Monica to be part of the board becoming the second black woman to make it to the board. Dr. Catherine Nakalembe	Kampala	<p>She is a Ugandan scientist working with National Aeronautics and space (NASA) as the Africa Program Director in the National Aeronautics and space (NASA) Harvest Program. She is a food security laureate with Master's Degree from Johns Hopkins University.</p> <p>She has a PhD in Geographical Science and her research aimed to highlight the consequences of drought on land use and on the lives of North Eastern Ugandans. It also, was the first step in forming the basis of the remote sensing element of the Disaster Risk Financing Project which has supported over 75,000 households in the region since its inception saving the Uganda Government resources that would otherwise go towards emergency assistance.</p> <p>Her remote sensing and machine learning technology has supported agriculture and food security across Africa. She has conducted research in remote sensing of drought, agriculture, and leading the integration of earth observations in agricultural monitoring of small holder agriculture in multiple countries.</p> <p>She pioneered the remote sensing of unmanned aerial vehicles in surveying refugee settlements and landslide mapping in Uganda. She leads initiative to prevent potentially disastrous impacts of crop failure.</p>

			<p>In 2020, she shared the Africa Food Prize (AFP) with Dr. André Bationo from Burkina Faso. Olusegun Obasanjo. She was also a 2020 University of Meliland Division (UMD) Research Excellence Honoree and in 2019 was a recipient of the Inaugural Group of Earth Observations (GEO) Individual Excellence Award. She was featured in the 2020 Women and GIS, Volume 2: Stars of Spatial Science ESRI Press book</p>
23.	Peruth Chemutai	Kapchorwa	<p>She was born July 10, 1999, a Ugandan, steeplechase runner. Hailing from the Bukwo District, she took up running in 2013 after attending the District Athletics Championships in Bukwo as a casual fan. At the 2015 Commonwealth Youth Games in Apia, she won silver medals in the 1500 meters and 3000 meters.</p> <p>At the 2018 World Junior Championships held in mid-July, she claimed a notable Silver medal in the 3000m steeplechase. A week later, at the Monaco diamond league, she set a National record with a time of 9:07.94</p> <p>She won the gold medal at the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo in the women's 3000 meters steeplechase race, becoming the first Ugandan woman ever to win an Olympic Medal.</p>

Kiplimo Jacob	Kapchorwa	<p>Jacob Kiplimo was born 14 November 2000, a Ugandan long-distance runner who competes in track running events.</p> <p>He got a bronze medal in the 10,000m final in Tokyo Olympics.</p> <p>He is the 2020 Half Marathon World Champion. He represented his country at the 2016 Summer Olympics.</p> <p>At the age of fifteen he won the 10,000 metres bronze medal at the 2016 IAAF World U20 Championships As a result, he became the youngest ever Olympian for Uganda.</p>

			<p>At age 16, Jacob Kiplimo produced a performance of a lifetime to win Gold in the men's U20 race at the 2017 IAAF World Cross Country Championships in Kampala, the country's first ever Gold Medal at a World Cross, covering the 8 km course in 22:40 minutes.</p> <p>He is the 2017 IAAF World Cross Country Junior champion. In 2019, he became the World Cross Country Silver medalist at the age of 18.</p> <p>Kiplimo won the San Silvestre 10k in a time of 26:41 on 31 Dec 2018. His win set a new course record, formerly set by Eliud Kipchoge in 2006 with 26:54.</p> <p>At the Ugandan Cross Country Championships on 16 Feb 2019 in Tororo, Kiplimo defeated Joshua Cheptegei by both placing first and second respectively. In the men's senior race over 10 km, Kiplimo won by an 11-second lead over the 10,000 m world championship runner up.</p> <p>At the 2019 IAAF World Cross Country Championships in Aarhus, Denmark, Kiplimo finished second in the senior men's race 4 seconds after Joshua Cheptegei's winning time of 31:40. He won the gold medal in the teams ranking with Cheptegei from Uganda.</p> <p>On 17th September, 2020 Kiplimo won a Diamond League 3000 m run in Rome, the fastest 3000 m since Kenenisa's in August 2007. Kiplimo's time is the 8th fastest time ever.</p> <p>He won the Half Marathon World Championship on 17 October 2020. The event took place in Gdynia, Poland and was a Ugandan record and championship record.</p>
25.	Mawerere Charles	Jinja	<p>He was born on 13th May, 1953, in Jinja.</p> <p>He is a model cassava farmer who distributes free cassava stem to communities to fight hunger and also have food security. He has helped</p>

			<p>farmers add value to their cassava by advising them to sell flour instead of raw cassava.</p> <p>He is a dairy farmer and a model one in his area of jurisdiction. He sells milk to the community.</p> <p>He has constructed energy savings stoves for all the blind in the district.</p> <p>He planted trees at all H.C IIs in Buwenge rural.</p> <p>He proposed to plant Busoga Cultural Forest with all the indigenous species in Busoga, so that the next generation recognizes the nature of trees which used to make materials like bark cloths, musical instruments and herbal medicines, to mention but a few. He is waiting approval from the cultural institution to start the project.</p> <p>He is a pillar in the development despite his disability (blind).</p>

Mwangale Mubeeke Robinah	Namutumba	<p>She was born on 23rd December, 1962 in Nsinzi Busiki – Namutumba District.</p> <p>She is a Senior Health Educator Jinja District.</p> <p>She has been in the Civil service since 07/7/1986.</p> <p>During the response to Crimean Congo Haemorrhagic Fever Virus and COVID pandemic in Jinja, she was the first to visit hotspots of the epidemic.</p> <p>She aired messages on how to manage diarrhea among the under 5 years which contributed to reduction in morbidity and mortality in Busoga region.</p> <p>She educated the people to manage Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and Public Health and has been very instrumental in that area in the District.</p>
27.	Mr. Frank Kalimuzo	Kabale	<p>He was the first Vice Chancellor of Makerere University appointed on July 1, 1970, for a 5 year term.</p>

			<p>A revered civil servant, Kalimuzo was Uganda's first Permanent Secretary and Head of Civil Service soon after independence until July 1, 1970 when he was appointed Vice Chancellor.</p> <p>As a Vice Chancellor, Kalimuzo mentored and helped many Lecturers like Supreme Court Justice George William Kanyeihamba who were targets of the regime then.</p> <p>However Kalimuzo never survived the henchmen of the regime then. He was killed while in service to the people of Uganda.</p>
28.	Mr. Gollapalli Naga Mohana Rao	Kampala	<p>He is the Chairman/Indian association of Uganda. He came to Uganda in 1997. He has established a chain of businesses in Uganda, like Grow More Seeds and chemical Ltd (GMS), among others</p> <p>He is engaged in professional service like research, production, importation, distribution of quality vegetables and field crop seeds as well as agricultural chemical fertilizers and very many other investments estimated at a tune of 7.5 million USDs.</p> <p>He has mobilized more than 13,500 out growers through ABI trust and also worked with prestigious institutions like world vision, UNHRC. He has contributed tremendously to our development agenda of attaining the vision 2040 by adding value to agricultural products and creation of employment opportunities to many Ugandans working in his group of companies.</p> <p>During COVID-19 pandemic outbreak, he mobilized over 3.5 billion from the Indian business community towards His Excellency's effort to fight the spread of the pandemic and donated 22 double cabins pickups.</p>
29.	Dr. Stephen Birungi	Kibuku	<p>Dr. Stephen Birungi is a Veterinary Doctor. He is a Lay leader in the Kirika Church of Uganda Parish, he has unified the parish and mobilized them to start building one of the biggest and most modern Cathedrals in Eastern Uganda on a self-help basis. This Cathedral will also have a modern adult training center as annex to impart skills to Ugandans.</p>

			<p>He has spearheaded the founding of a secondary school St John's SS Kirika, based on partnership between the Government, the community and the church, it's the first secondary school in the sub county built by people's own initiative under his guidance and leadership.</p> <p>He worked with the Dutch to set up the first-ever Factory of its kind in East and Central Africa to manufacture veterinary medicines in the country.</p> <p>He initiated programs for economic empowerment of Kibuku district and Bukedi region by starting the first skilling center, called KaDI skilling centre, for social economic empowerment of the youth.</p>
30.	Onyach Onecimo Oyoo (RIP)	Gulu	<p>The was born in 1917 in Koro-Abili Gulu district. He was a Grade Three Magistrate of Kitgum and Kasese Districts from 1963 to 1976.</p> <p>He was the founder of the scouts movement in Acholi Sub Region aiming at developing the youth in to self-reliant citizens who are accepted in every community.</p> <p>He promoted inter-religious denomination unity among Muslims, Protestant, catholic and traditionalist in the year 1940.</p> <p>He was a Classroom Teacher in Gulu Primary School and later on a Head teacher in Keyo Primary School in Amuru District in the years between 1940-1950.</p> <p>He was a Sub-County Chief of Koro and Awere Sub-County Omoro Districts formerly Gulu District.</p> <p>He was the Chairperson board of governors of Gulu high school and Gulu secondary school from 1978 to 1998.</p> <p>While in Amnesty commission he persuaded LRA rebels to surrender to the Government and supported the RDC of Gulu District the late Omoro Justine.</p>

3.0 Mr. Renzo Piano
